# Bond Update







The past couple of summers have been busier than usual around the schools. This summer is no different, maybe more so. Thanks to community support the district passed a millage in 2020. Those funds are being used to both upgrade our existing buildings as well as add additional space, and create a secure entrance to the middle/high school. Overall the millage will generate 21 million dollars. Not all that money is collected at one time. Rather there are five series spread over a number of years. The funds from series 1, which took two years to complete, was spent on upgrades to the elementary and reworking parking lots and roadways along with adding additional parking.



This past spring Series II got underway. This includes additions to both the elementary and the middle/high school. The elementary will receive two new classrooms. The middle and high school will each receive two classrooms and four bathrooms up and downstairs.

The final part of Series II will include a secure entrance to the high school/middle school building, and offices to accommodate the redesign of the current offices. As the district has expanded opportunities and services to students more space is needed. In the past few years, the district has added social workers, an academic success coach, an instructional technology coach, and a middle school principal. We are hoping to bring back the school nurse as well for the fall. All these folks require spaces to work and meet with students.

I am very pleased to say the project is moving along on schedule. The new front entrance and offices should be ready to open when we return from Thanksgiving break. The classroom and bathroom additions should be ready to use when we all return from Christmas break. An open house for the community is in order, but we've not set a date for that at this time.

### **Annual Notices**

FERPA Requirements: Morley Stanwood Community Schools may disclose, without consent, "directory" information defined as student's name, grade level, address, date of birth, honors and awards, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, and weight and height of athletic team members. However, schools must tell parents and eligible students about directory information and allow parents and eligible students a reasonable amount of time to request that the school not disclose directory information about them. Schools must notify parents and eligible students annually of their rights under FERPA. The District may disclose "directory" information without prior written consent unless the building principal is notified to the contrary in writing. Each building administrator maintains a list of student names wherein disclosure has been refused. These lists are reviewed yearly. Federal and Michigan law requires Morley Stanwood Community Schools to provide military recruiters, upon request, the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of high school students. This information can only be used to provide information to students concerning educational and career opportunities available in the UI.S. Armed Forces or service academies. A parent/guardian or 18-year-old student may exercise the option to withhold consent for the release of this information to military recruiters by submitting a signed written request to that effect to the high school principal.

## OPEN ENROLLMENT SCHOOLS OF CHOICE

School of Choice Applications for the 2023-2024 school year are now being accepted. Any student who resides within the Mecosta-Osceola Intermediate School District may apply for acceptance to his/her school of choice. Any student who resides in an ISD that is adjacent (a contiguous district in another ISD) to a MOISD school district may apply for Section 105c for acceptance. Applications can be obtained at the school the student wishes to attend. An application form must be completed for each student wishing to participate in the Schools of Choice program. The enrollment period for considering applications for the first semester is through the Friday of the first week of school (August 25th, 2023).

### **HEALTH CONCERN CELL PHONE USE**



Some summer reading has led me to write this letter. Casual observation of kids in the hallway during the school year prompted the reading. Doing so led me to some particularly interesting information about cell phones as it relates to children's mental health that I thought I would share with all of you. One reason for the particular concern amongst developing young adults is just that; the brains of young adults are still developing. Therefore, the impact of significant phone use been researched and documented.

It was not difficult to find numerous articles that discuss the negative impact cell phones and social media have on pre-teens, teens and young adults. I will admit what I read is disconcerting. There has been a noticeable significant rise in anxiety and depression among teens and voung adults over the past decade. Much of the research connects this to the rapid expansion of cellphone use, and what has been termed as "smart phone addiction." I determined to also looked up some ideas to share that parents can consider to help offset the excessive use of cell phones.

Below, are both the recommended screen times for various age groups, and the actual average screen time. The article: (18+ Teen & Kids Screen Time Statistics (2023): Avg. Screen Time for Teens by Peter Susic).

Recommended cell phone/screen time by age groups:

0-18 months

No screen time at all

18-24 months

A few hours per week

2-5 years old

1 hour per weekday and up to 3 hours on

weekend

5-17 years old

2 hours per day

The average cell phone/screen time by age groups:

0-8 years old 2.5 hours 8-10 years old 6 hours 11-14 years old 9 hours 15-18 years old 7.5 hours

Concerns and problems from cell phone use range from very little to very bad. Some problems can exhibit themselves as lower grades, lower social interaction with peers, absenteeism from work and school.

On the other end of the spectrum are problems with depression, increased anxiety, loneliness/social withdrawal, self-harm, and even suicidal tendencies/ideation. Lastly, there's an increased risk of virtual/digital increased harassment. and an opportunity to come in contact with adults with ill intentions, and teenage runaway.

Here are some helpful ideas you may want to consider. This information comes from an organization called Parents Universal Resource Experts P.U.R.E. The article; (How Cell Phones Effect Teenagers Mental Health).

- 1.Establish device-free time. Disconnecting is very important to improve mental wellness.
- 2.Limit notifications to just a couple of platforms, including phone calls and texts.
- 3. Meal time is for eating, spend time together at the dinner table talking not texting.
- 4.Lastly, night-time is for sleeping. It is recommended to shut down devices an hour before its time to go to bed.


